Minutes of the meeting of Deeping St James Parish Council held on Thursday 27 September 2018 at 7.30 pm at The Institute.

Present: Councillors Barber, Blessett, Bowell, Dilks (District), Gilbert, Hall, Halls, Hardy, Hosking, Pelling, Shinkins, Stevens (District), Thomas, Ward, County Councillor Dobson and two members of the public.

The Clerk took the minutes.

Councillor Pelling agreed to write the press report

OPEN FORUM

Caroline Herron spoke in support of the application for grant funding towards repairs to the Priory Hall roof.

Paul Smith spoke on in support of the application for grant funding towards the purchase of a replacement stretcher after the current one had been damaged by the hospital during its use recently and a defibrillator as it was soon to become an FA requirement for all football clubs to have one.

County Councillor Dobson had shared a report prior to the meeting. He reiterated that serious thought was being given by LCC to changing all street lighting to LED rather having some lights on the part night system. Councillor Barber asked him to investigate the possibility of having a lamppost installed on the junction of Linchfield Road to Towngate East especially as the Parish Council had precept a figure to cover the purchase and installation costs of this. Councillor Barber also asked that the overgrowth around the road signs coming up to roundabouts in the area be cut back as a matter of urgency especially on the A1175 coming into Market Deeping from Stamford. Councillor Barber also requested that the public rights of way are cut back of overgrowth more frequently than at the moment.

Councillor Dobson ended by advising that the School Crossing Patrol vacancy at Linchfield School had not been filled so another drive to so would take place.

District Councillor Stevens advised that she had asked SKDC to make good an area on the green on Exeter Close which had been left in a poor condition after a utilities company had recently used the area for a compound. She was also discussing the possibility of SKDC obtaining permission from LCC and paying for the installation of an electricity power supply on Jubilee Park for use at events.

District Councillor Dilks brought to the attention of the Councillors that the District had a number of problems with the condenser boilers currently installed in the local Authority Housing.

A representative from the Neighbourhood Policing team was not present but a report had been provided which mentioned the ongoing problems with anti-social behaviour from especially on the open spaces in The Deepings and reminding people to continue to report all incidences and information to 101. District Councillor Stevens added that the grass in the corner at Jubilee Park would be cut back at the end of the season and the trees would also be thinned, hopefully clearing the area would reduce the ant-social behaviour taking place there.

58.19 To consider the location for the WW1 commemorative planter and agree to obtain permissions and undertake any preparatory ground works

It was proposed seconded and **RESOLVED** that the planter would be

located on the green at Churchgate. The Clerk agreed to contact the manufacturer to ask what preparatory groundworks were required and then arrange for them to be done.

59.19 Proposal from SKDC regarding utilising the DSJPC Maintenance Worker for small local jobs

The Clerk explained that an SKDC Officer had made this suggestion because using staff in the area would be cheaper than sending someone from the District Office or a Contractor from outside of the area. Councillor Stevens proposed, seconded and **RESOLVED** that both she and Councillor Dilks arrange to speak to District Councillor Dr Moseley the Cabinet Member responsible for this and report back to the Parish Council.

60.19 To consider the continuance of monthly councillor's surgeries

Councillor Shinkins-Hoppe referred to the paper that had been circulated explaining that she felt the surgeries should continue but changing the format and the location should be considered. Councillor Dilks stated that having the gazebo at a number of community events was offering a surgery in a different format and location. It was proposed seconded and **RESOLVED** that the surgeries would continue at the Deepings Community Library but this should be reviewed at regular intervals.

61.19 To consider discussing with representatives from SKDC the transfer of land ownership from District to Parish Council responsibility

Councillor Ward as Chair of Allotments footpaths and open spaces had completed an audit of all the open spaces in the parish most of which were owned by SKDC but had been enhanced by DSJPC. He asked if the parish council wished to instigate discussions with SKDC about the potential transfer of ownership of some of these open spaces to DSJPC especially as budget restrictions will mean SKDC will be less likely to spend money on such areas and some responsibilities may well be devolved to parish councils. It was proposed seconded and **RESOLVED** that Councillor Ward takes this forward.

62.19 Parish pump – items for information or inclusion on future agendas

- Councillor Shinkins-Hoppe volunteered to write the press report for the next meeting
- Councillor Blessett reminded everyone that Linden Homes would be making a pre-planning application presentation to the Council at 7pm on Thursday 18 October in respect of the development on Linchfield Road
- Councillor Gilbert made everyone aware of the 30th anniversary celebrations at Kingsgate Community Church Parnwell, Peterborough. All Welcome to attend
- Councillor Hardy asked the Clerk to pass on the parish council's thanks for clearing the drain at the bottom of Cowslip Drive.
- Councillor Ward advised that the necessary checks required by the Welland and Deeping Internal Drainage Board before they would allow permission for Bird's mouth fencing to be installed on the verge along Spalding Road had been completed and quotes would now be obtained.
- Councillor Stevens reminded everyone of the Macmillan Coffee morning's taking place tomorrow and also asked everyone to help in promoting the 100 years on Music Hall event from 7.30pm on 10 November 2018 and the Battles Over A Nation's

Tribute beacon lighting event from 6pm on 11 November 2018

- Councillor Dilks reminded those involved of the Remembrance working party meeting on Thursday 4 October 2018 and advised that he would be attending the Police training on road closures procedures on Saturday 29 September 2018.
