## DSJ sign the Charter for Trees Woods and People

Led by The Woodland Trust, more than 70 organisations from across multiple sectors have joined forces to create a Charter for Trees, Woods and People that will guide policy and practice in the UK, and the Parish Council is proud to be a Charter Signatory.



The new Tree Charter will be launched on 6th November, at Lincoln Castle, on the 800th anniversary of the influential 1217 Charter of the Forest.The Tree Charter aims to protect important



trees and woods, as well as planting for the future. It will also promote the natural health benefits of trees, as well as providing a thriving habitat for diverse species of native wildlife. Over the summer the Parish Council have collected 170 signatures for The Tree Charter, and in return the Woodland Trust will plant a tree for every signature collected.

Closer to home Oakwood Financial Services ran a buzzer game at the Deepings Beer Festival and matched all attempts to create a fund used to donate fifty trees each to the Parish and Town Councils which will be planted in the area this Autumn. Some of these services can be taken on by the Parish Council, but this will require an increase in the Parish share of Council Tax. One such service that we will be taking on in the future is grass cutting in the Parish.

As a body Councillors have to do the best for the people they represent, whilst obtaining best value for money, as well as balancing the budget.

We cannot therefore take on all the services that we are losing, and some people will be disappointed. Difficult choices will have to be made, and we are always reluctant to raise our share of Council Tax.

## Skatepark replacement

The removal and replacement of the 14 year old skate park at Woody Heights started on 11 September 2017, and if the weather is favourable, work will be completed within 10 weeks. During the construction phase the area will be fenced off and will be unavailable for use.

A third of project cost is being funded by the Landfill Communities Fund



administered by WREN, supported by Deeping St James United Charities. Other funding was obtained from the parish council tax precept, donations from students at The Deepings School, individual donations at community engagement events, SKDC planning section 106 contributions, LCC Councillor Big Society Fund.

## GRASS CUTTING within DSJ

Next year the Parish Council is taking over the responsibility of cutting the grass verges and some other areas of land from Lincs County Council. During the first year the Parish Council will be working in partnership with Market Deeping Town Council and appointing a contractor to

carry out the work that is required. This year, like many other Parishes, we have seen the regularity of the cutting reduced which has resulted in unsightly overgrowth of weeds/grass/bushes along our roadsides. Our new contract will nearly double the number of cuts done this year and hopefully make "THE DEEPINGS" looked loved and lived in.

Please remember, this is the first time the Parish Council has undertaken such a role and there will be teething problems, but we are hopeful that, with the full

*Tubilee Park, replacing support* of our contractor, a better service will be delivered then has been offered this year. As the year unfolds, improvements will be seen in areas that have been neglected in the past and they will be regularly maintained. I would like to point out that a lot of work over the last 12 years, has been carried out by the

Community Payback team, who have been attacking "Grot spots" around our Parish, and hopefully making a big difference to you all. To them I give a big thank you. In a couple of months we will be planting 400 Daffodils along the river bank, to add to the same amount planted last year, plus some additional crocuses on other open spaces in the parish. What a wonderful sight it was in the spring, lets hope it will be a mass of colour next year.

This year is the centenary of Passchendaele fought by the Allies on the Western Front between July and November 2017. It was a particularly bloody Battle known for the horrific conditions caused by torrential rain and ensuing mud. It also saw the loss or



injury of a third of a million Allied troops. Those from DSj lost in the Battle were; John Bingham, Charles Cook, John Freeman, Thomas Lyon, James Russell, Frank Sanderson, Thomas Smith and Herbert Smitheringale. John Eldred, one time resident of Horsegate died in the battle aged just 22, Harold Patman whose parents had the George & Dragon in Eastgate lost his life in August while Charles Savage of DSJ was killed later that year at the Battle of Cambrai. On Sunday 12th November there will be a Remembrance Service at the Priory Church at 3.00pm. If you can it would be a fitting tribute that as many of us attend that service to remember those that left our village never to return.
