This year there was a very strong field of nominees for the Awards which were presented by triathlete, Kayleigh Adams, resident of DSJ and member of the under 20's GB triathelte team.

Much of the valued historic research done in the village would not be possible without the vivid memories and publications of Dorothea Price and Nancy Titman, both of whom were nominated for an Award. Kerry Pirie was also nominated for bringing over 2,000 people together under the facebook page 'Mad woman with a dog in a a buggy'. Dorothy Bellairs and the Revd. Mark Thompson from the Priory Church were also nominated for their tireless work. Mark was a driving force behind the foodbank. Peter Ward was President of the Rugby Club but is also a Lives First Responder and member of DSJ United Charities. Member of Deepings Friendship Club and Age Concern

Volunteer. Ann Parmenter was nominated for this work and also for daily good neighbourliness. Cherylle Parsons was nominated for her 'huge heart expecting nothing in return' for the hours she continues to give children at Linchfield School following her retirement as a teacher after 24 years. Joan Dyke however was a worthy winner, running the local playgroup for years which included challenging and disabled children. She is a stalwart of the Rose & Sweet Pea Show, member of the Priory Church Choir. on the Church Flower rota and having served meals on wheels for over 20 years she is now a valued helper at Age Concern.

Sam Niblock headed the young person category, nominated for the enthusiastically helping to run a local youth group. Others shortlisted were Daniel White, College Captain at the Deepings School who went to the aid of a victim of a road traffic accident, Joe Schollar for providing light and sound at numerous school performances and for assisting when a man collapsed in Market Deeping, Nathan Cook the contribution to the school community and for technical support at drama events and at the hustings recently. Phoebe Wells was shortlisted for the work for the Alzheimer's Society, recently organising a bake sale.


Supporting the Deeping Show for many years, my fudge stall can now be seen at local events such as the Raft Race and the Carnival. As well as

No flytipping!

The Parish Council provides a skip for residents of Deeping St James to dispose of unwanted household items.

The skip is situated at Deepings Recycling Centre on Station Road and is available every Saturday from 8am until 5pm, or until full. Items that can be disposed of free of charge include beds, flat packed furniture, carpets, polystyrene and sofas.

Other items that can be recycled at the centre free of charge include paper, cardboard, clothes, plastic and some metals.

Wood, hardcore, soil, car tyres, computer monitors and TV's can also be disposed of for a small charge.



New River Welland Footbridge



Some three years a group calling themselves The Northern Footpath Forum floated the idea of a new footbridge over the river Welland to enable walkers from parishes such as Peakirk, Northborough and Glinton to access the northern bank of the river and the Nature Reserve.....without trespassing on the railway line or having to make a long detour by car.

DSJ Parish Council has been very supportive of this scheme. It would create an excellent circular walk in verv attractive, and tranquil, countryside, and be of great benefit to many people for many years to come.

We are now very hopeful that this year will see the idea become reality. All the survey work has been completed, the drawings for the bridge have been drawn up and a firm quotation from the contractors received. There is the small matter of funding still to be resolved, although many agencies have pledged their support.

A public meeting earlier this month promoted the project more widely.

The footbridge will be some 30 metres east of the railway bridge and completely in the parish of DSJ.
