This Summer we. delighted that are both Madcaps and Forest Garden Our each providing a scheme offering a range of activities.



The fun starts off at Our Forest Garden offering two sessions each day between Monday 25th July to Friday 29th July. Mornings run from 9.30am to 12 noon, followed by the afternoon session from 1pm to 3.30pm. All these sessions are outdoors with plenty of room to explore, dig, climb, play in the mud kitchen and meet the chickens.

Sue and her team at Madcaps then offer morning sessions from Monday 8th to Friday 12th August. This will be a week of varied and fun activities, including





sport, art and crafts and many more, ensuring everyone has the best time.

## **Nomination**



Clerk to DSJ Parish Council has been nominated Clerk of the Year in the Shining Stars Awards 2022 organised by Lincolnshire Association of Local Councils.

### HERITAGE CONSTRUCTION CONSULTANT

St. James Deeping Signal Box Group are looking to appoint a qualified Heritage Construction Consultant to complete an assessment of the salvaged signal box materials and to produce the necessary specifications to allow the construction to proceed.

Within the scope of this project the Heritage Construction Consultant will:

- · Complete a thorough evaluation of the reclaimed Signal Box materials to determine the proportions which are suitable for reuse. (it is the ambition of the Group to retain and re-use as much of the original signal box material as possible. The potential for repair should be considered and like-for like replacement be recommended when necessary).
- Draw up necessary specifications for suitable replacement materials and provide cost estimates.
- Produce all necessary drawings, plans and specifications to allow the reconstruction

of the signal box and provide necessary cost estimates.

- · Provide specifications for loading with input from a structural engineer where necessary. This should include both floor loadings, and for the installation of the signal mechanism.
- Provide mentoring to support the Trustees and volunteers with the development of the capital project.

The project will take place between August 2022 and December 2022.

Contractors should provide a breakdown of their time allocation as part of their tender submission.

The maximum fee available for this work is £6000 excluding VAT.

Interviews held 1st - 3rd August 2022 Appointment confirmed 8th August 2022 The successful candidate will be appointed on the basis of relevant experience, understanding of the brief, availability of resources, and value for money.
